α2007 Tournament Rulesβ

The TDAA's 2007 *Petit Prix* is designed to provide a championship format suitable for performance by dogs of small stature.

General Rules

The TDAA Rules and Regulations currently in effect on the date of competition shall be the recognized standard for rules for games and standard rounds. All dogs must be registered with the TDAA in order to compete.

Eligibility

A dog shall be deemed eligible if he has competed in a TDAA trial since the 2006 *Petit Prix* (October 15, 2006). Dogs belonging to members of TDAA are automatically eligible for competition in the *Petit Prix*.

Friday Agility Trial

An agility trial will be held on Friday before the Tournament begins. Dogs that have never shown in TDAA and are not owned by members of TDAA will be required to run these classes to be eligible for the Semi-Finals. This round will include a standard course and one game separated by level as in a regular Trial. All levels (Beginner, Intermediate, Superior, Games I, Games II, and Games III) will be offered in the Friday rounds. Dogs already eligible for the tournament may also compete in these classes and will be eligible for placements and awards as in a regular TDAA trial. All qualifying scores will count towards TDAA titles.

Semi-Finals Competition and Qualification Notes

All dogs, without regard to competition level or titles earned, will compete on the same courses. All games and standard courses are eligible for dogs to earn qualifying legs towards TDAA titles. Standard courses will be judged under the TDAA Superior rules. Games will be judged under TDAA Games III rules. However, the dog will earn a qualifying score only at the level for which he is eligible.

Semi-Finals Scoring

The semi-finals shall include two standard course runs and four games. A dog shall earn points for placement in his class in each of these competitions, in this manner:

- 1st Place – 10 points
- 2nd Place – 7 points
- 3rd Place – 5 points
- 4th Place – 3 points
- 5th Place – 1 point

Placement points shall be accorded by jump height. The total of these placement points from the six semi-final rounds will determine which dogs progress to the championship round. The top 10 dogs from each jump height in the Semi-Final rounds shall be eligible to play in the final round with the stipulation that the dog *must* have earned one or more points in the Semi-Finals. *Ties in determining who will go to the championship round will be resolved with a run-off.*

The TDAA Petit Prix Championship Round

The final round will be a standard run and a game. Placement points will be awarded for the two championship rounds using a 10-9-8-7-6-5-4-3-2-1 point system with no points awarded for elimination. The dog with the most accumulated points in each jump height will be deemed the winner and Agility Champion Teacup Dog. The top 10 placements in each jump height will be recognized so long as the dog has not earned a score of elimination in either of the final rounds. In the event of a tie for first place after both runs, times in the two championship runs will be used to break the tie. If this does not break the tie, there will be a run-off to determine the first place winner. A coin toss will be used to break the other ties for overall placement. The dog shall be eligible for a qualifying score for titling purposes in the final round.

Height Divisions

Owners are responsible for entering the proper height division. Judges reserve the right to measure dogs entered in any trial. At the handler's option, dogs may be entered in a higher height division, but not in a division lower than their proper height division. Dogs that run in a height division lower than their proper division will be eliminated. To determine eligibility for **jump height exemptions**, please review the official TDAA rules and regulations.

- 4" for dogs 8" and under at the withers, or dogs with jump height exemption measuring 12" or less
- 8" for dogs 12" and under at the withers, or dogs with jump height exemption measuring 15" or less
- 12" for dogs 15" and under at the withers, or dogs with jump height exemption measuring 17" or less
- 16" for dogs 17" or less at the withers

α2007 Tournament Gamesβ

Complete Games rules and qualifying scores will be available at the Tournament. A brief description of the games is included here. For more comprehensive game descriptions, go to www.k9tdaa.com to the *Petit Prix* section or look in [The Clean Run Book of Agility Games](#), second edition, author Bud Houston.

Copycat: Trisha Stall developed this game. The goal is to score as many points as possible in a set period of time. The team must avoid performing the same “pointed” obstacle back to back, called copycatting, as this results in a penalty.

Triple-True Team Baton Relay: Invented by Linda Northrop in 1995 for teams of 3 dogs/3 handlers. The course consists of four sequences. Dog A does sequence one, Dog B does sequence two, Dog C does sequence three, and ALL dogs do sequence four. It is scored time plus faults with the lowest score winning.

Blackjack: Jonathan Brown invented this game. This game is scored points then time. The purpose of the game is to score exactly 21 points in the fastest time.

Gamblers Anonymous: Invented by Marsha and Bud Houston. The objective of this game is to accumulate as many points as possible in a limited period of time. Individual distance challenges on the course are available with one challenge having a high roller bonus.

Jumpers: This game is scored faults then time with a maximum possible score of 100. There are no contact obstacles in this game. It is scored faults then time.

Snooker: This is a two-part game: an opening sequence to earn points by completing a red obstacle followed by a pointed obstacle and a closing sequence, which is a numbered sequence. This game is scored points then time.

Tunnel Vision: This game is the invention of Darlene Woz. The course consists only of pipe tunnels, jumps and weaves poles. It is a numbered sequence course with distance challenges to the multiple tunnels. There is a jackpot obstacle for extra points. This is scored points, minus faults, then time. Highest score wins.

αTDAA Class Informationβ

Standard Class

BEGINNER AGILITY—All dogs shall be eligible for participation in this class. There shall be no grandfathering of titles from other organizations.

INTERMEDIATE AGILITY — Only dogs that have earned the Teacup Beginner Agile Dog (TBAD) shall be eligible for participation in this class.

SUPERIOR AGILITY — Only dogs that have earned the Teacup Intermediate Agile Dog (TIAD) or the Teacup Superior Agile Dog (TSAD) shall be eligible for participation in this class.

Games Class

GAMES I—All dogs shall be eligible for participation in this class. There shall be no grandfathering of titles from other organizations.

GAMES II — Only dogs that have earned the Games I (TG1) shall be eligible for participation in this class.

GAMES III — Only dogs that have earned the Games II (TG2) or Games III (TG3) shall be eligible for participation in this class.

αNotice to Exhibitorsβ

The safety of the dogs is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all obstacles safely.

WARM-UPS: A warm-up area, consisting of at least a regulation TDAA agility jump, will be provided for all exhibitors.

Acceptable Obstacles: A-Frame, Closed (*Collapsed*) Tunnel, Open (*Pipe*) Tunnel, Teeter, Table, Tire Jump, Weave Poles, Single and Winged Jumps, Dogwalk.

ELIGIBILITY: This event is open to all registered TDAA dogs over the age of 12 months that meet the Tournament entry requirements, except bitches in season, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity, injury, or illness which may affect a dog's physical or mental performance.

SHOW SITE: This event will be run **indoors** in 65x65 ring on packed dirt in a climate-controlled building. There are bleachers to watch the event plus a large indoor area for crating dogs. There are lots of grassy areas for walking.

JUDGING: Judging will begin at 12 noon on Friday; at 8:00 am on Saturday; and at 7:30 am on Sunday.

FOOD: A food vendor will be on site to offer breakfast and lunch food. Fast food restaurants and shopping are available within three miles of the site. Competitors may also bring their own lunches.

AWARDS: Ribbons will be awarded for 1st through 5th in each jump height in each class in the tournament semi-finals as well as the Friday trial rounds. Qualifying ribbons will be awarded to all dogs receiving a qualifying score. Dogs may receive placement ribbons without qualifying. Dogs placing in the top ten in each height in the championship round will receive special TDAA Tournament rosettes.

Conduct and Apparel: Unsportsmanlike conduct, including rough handling or misconduct of any kind, will result in an excusal from the ring. Exhibitors may wear shirts or insignia of their training group if they wish.

At the handler's option, the dog may wear a flat (buckle or quick release) collar or collar with other attachments. Choke collars, pinch collars, electric and dummy electric collars are not permitted. Dogs will not be eliminated for wearing clothing.

All dogs must be on leash or crated at all times except when in the ring or when in the designated agility warm-up area. It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the Trial Committee, be asked to leave the trial site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made.

Food and toys are not permitted in the course area and handlers are not allowed to use whistles or other instruments or devices. Food, treats, dogs and toys are **restricted** to the warm-up area, the bleachers, and 10 feet back from the gate to and sides of the agility ring. Exhibitors are responsible for being at the ring gate when it is their turn to run.

Entries

Entries: Entries close at 6:00 p.m. CST October 1st, 2007, after which time entries cannot be cancelled, altered, or substituted.

Entries will not be accepted without fees. No entries will be accepted which require a signature for delivery. All entries must be submitted on official TDAA Agility Entry Forms, one dog per entry form.

Photocopied entries without the TDAA agreement on the back or attached are NOT acceptable. Unsigned, incomplete, or illegible entries are NOT acceptable. Faxed entries and/or credit cards are not accepted. Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry fee.

The Trial Secretary will add a \$25.00 service charge for any returned checks. Subsequent returned checks from the same exhibitor may result in their being put on a CASH ONLY basis.

Entry fees will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by action of the Trial Committee.

No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot be opened or completed by reason of riots, civil disturbance, fire, an act of God, public emergency, an act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee.

Bitches in season are not permitted in the trial. The club will refund all but \$5.00 of the entry fee for bitches unable to compete for that reason. Bitches and dogs unable to compete because of injury will receive a partial refund if notification from a Veterinarian of such a claim is received before October 8, 2007.

Early Bird Registration period is from April 1st through June 1st. During this time, there is a discounted pricing structure for tournament activities. Entries postmarked after June 1st will pay the full fees. Entries may be for Friday events only, the tournament events (semi-final, final and championship rounds), or the Friday events and tournament events together. Entry and fees for the Weave Pole Challenge will be done day of show. Read the entry form carefully to accurately calculate your fees.

Weave Pole Challenge

☺ Returning by Popular Demand ☺

Briefing: This optional event will determine the fastest TDAA dogs in a 24 weave pole challenge. Dogs will be judged against other dogs in their jump height with a winner announced in each jump height.

When: This optional event will be available on Saturday between the hours of 10 am and 3 pm and on Sunday between 8 am and 11 am. The winners will be announced at noon on Sunday.

Registration: Pre-registration for this event is not required. Any TDAA registered dog may participate in this event even if not registered for other tournament events. Dog-handler teams may enter this event as many times as they wish during the posted times. The fastest time will be the one that wins.

Judging: The weave pole challenge will be judged using TDAA Superior rules and regulations. Weave pole centers will be 18”.

Cost: Each “run” through the weave poles will be \$2. This will be done on a cash only basis at the time you request to run the challenge.

Prizes: The winner at each jump height will get a special ribbon. All dogs successfully completing the weave pole challenge will receive a recognition memento for participation. Special recognition will be given to juniors participating in this event.

Team Competition

☺ Returning by Popular Demand ☺

Briefing: An optional team competition will be held on Friday evening. There will be a winner determined in each of the two jump height divisions: mini (teams with dogs that jump 4” and 8”) and maxi (teams with dogs that jump 12” and 16”). The game for the team competition this year will be True Triple Team Relay.

Team Determination: There will be 3 dogs on each team. A **draw** for the composition of each team will be done at 4:30 pm on Friday.

Jump Heights: Teams will be divided into two divisions: mini and maxi. The mini teams will have dogs that jump 4” and 8” on them. Dogs on these teams will all jump 4” in the team competition. The maxi teams will have dogs that jump 12” and 16” on them. Dogs on these teams will all jump 12” in the team competition.

Awards: First place ribbons will be given to the winning team in each division.

Fee: There is no additional fee for this event for those entered in the Petit Prix Tournament. You may enter this event at a cost of \$15 if you are not entered in the Petit Prix Tournament Events of Saturday and Sunday.

This camp will be offered on Wednesday and Thursday preceding the 2007 Petit Prix National Tournament. It will be offered at the dog training facility in Chatham (a suburb of Springfield, the site of the Petit Prix) to allow participants to remain in one hotel for both the camp and the tournament. Chatham is about 20 minutes from the trial site.

Pre-registration is required for this event. Registrations will be accepted on a first come, first serve basis. **A camp limit of 15 dog-handler teams has been established. The deadline for registration is September 30th.** There is no limit to the number of auditors.

During this camp, teams will practice on teacup equipment with emphasis on the challenges that a teacup course might present. Participants should expect individual attention to their team. This seminar will be held indoors and/or outdoors in a fenced area at the leader's discretion.

The fee includes the cost of instruction and lunch each day.
