The TDAA Rules and Regulations currently in effect on the date of competition shall be the recognized standard for rules for games and standard courses. The TDAA waives the requirement for use of the table in the standard rounds. However, use of the table is not precluded.

All dogs must be registered with the TDAA in order to compete.

A dog shall be deemed eligible to compete in the *Petit Prix* if he has competed at a TDAA trial since June 1, 2015 or if the handler is a member of the TDAA in good standing.

All dogs will run all ten standard courses and games of the Tournament.

Placement, Scoring Format, and Tie-breaking

A dog shall earn points for *placement within the field*. Points shall be accorded to the dog against the over-all field for the purpose of seeding the running order, and ranking all dogs. Scoring shall use a point table (placement inverse to count) to ensure that top performing dogs are equitably recognized.

Dogs running with a jump height exemption shall be scored against dogs of the measured height and not the exemption height. Dogs jumping with a "self-declared" height exemption beyond veteran and body-type exemptions shall *not* be eligible for placement within the tournament but shall be eligible for qualifying scores toward TDAA titles.

Scoring will be weighted, with the dog's final score adjusted by jump height. The weight factor might be applied to playing time, total combined score, or points earned. The basic weighting will be based on these values:

- Dogs scored at 16" = 1.00
- Dogs scored at 12" = .90
- Dogs scored at 8" = .76
- Dogs scored at 4" = .60

The definitive reference for agility games is *The Book of Agility Games* which can be purchased at nominal cost at www.dogagility.org/newstore.

Semi-Final Competition and Qualification Notes

All dogs, without regard to competition level, or titles earned, shall compete on the same courses. All games and courses are eligible for dogs to earn qualifying legs towards TDAA titles. Standard courses will be judged under the TDAA Superior rules. Games will be judged under TDAA Games III rules. However, the dog shall earn a qualifying score only at the level for which he is eligible.

NOTE: Course Time differentials for Beg/G1, Int/G2, Vet Dog, or Disabled Handler will not be used for Tournament Scoring. These differentials may be used by the score table to determine if a team earns a qualifying score at the level for which they are eligible and for any Special Awards for the event. Any maximum course times used will accommodate this. Some games have scoring criteria where these additional time allowances will not apply.

The Semi-Finals shall include three standard courses and six games.

The Championship Round

The final competition of the Petit Prix Tournament - and the Championship round - shall be the game *Jumpers*. The order shall be jump height and then reverse seed. Dogs running with a jump height exemption shall be run at the end of that jump height.

All dogs will compete in the Championship round.



Championship Round Scoring

Each dog shall enter the final round carrying all placement points earned throughout the tournament. Placement within each jump height will be based on the total accrual of those placement points. The dog with the highest total score in each jump height shall be deemed the winner and Agility Champion Teacup Dog. The top 10 placements in each jump height will be recognized.

TDAA National Agility Championship Title

The Teacup Dogs Agility Association will award TDAA National Agility Championship Title (TNAC) upon the dog that: 1) achieves the highest overall score in each jump height at the TDAA Petit Prix, and 2) scores among the top 25 dogs in the tournament.

This is a unique title in our agility culture as it is a championship earned by excellence in competition; specifically, by an unambiguous win in the national tournament.

GAMES

Dare to Double

Dare to Double is a dog's-choice game. The objective is to score as many points as possible, repeating a doubling obstacle on course (traditionally the A-frame) as often as time allows. The dog risks losing half his points if the A-frame is faulted! The dog must get to the finish obstacle before course tie elapses or be penalized. *Dare to Double* is scored Points, then Time.

Gamblers

Gamblers is a two-part game: dog's choice point accumulation followed by a distance challenge. The objective of Gamblers is for the dog-and-handler team to accumulate as many points as possible in the allotted time and to successfully complete the distance challenge. *Gamblers* is scored Points, then Time.

Box Game

The Box game is a sequencing game, typically using only jumps and tunnels, that provides for bonuses for the dog working at a distance. *The Box Game* is scored Time, Plus Faults, Less Bonuses.

Wild West Pinball

The objective of *Wild West Pinball* is to accumulate as many points as possible by performing groups of mini-sequences in the allotted time. *Wild West Pinball* is scored Points, then Time.

Weakest Link

Weakest Link is a dog's choice point accumulation game that requires a handler to "bank" points to keep them; or lose points that are not banked. In this game points earned must be worth as much as or more than the last points earned; and are safe only when banked. There may be a distance challenge with an extraordinary bonus value. *Weakest Link* is scored Points, Then Time.

Twister

Twister is a fast moving point accumulation game with multiple and rapid changes of direction on a circular unnumbered course consisting of inner and outer tracks made up of tunnels and jumps. *Twister* is scored Points, then Time.

Jumpers

Jumpers is a simple numbered course made up mostly of jumps, with tunnels, the tire and weave poles allowed. The objective of the game is to complete the course in the specified order, as quickly as possible, without faults. *Jumpers* is scored Faults, then Time.

Disclaimer

Judge's briefing on day of trial supersedes any previous briefings. The judge will discuss in more detail the game techniques.

Notice to Exhibitors

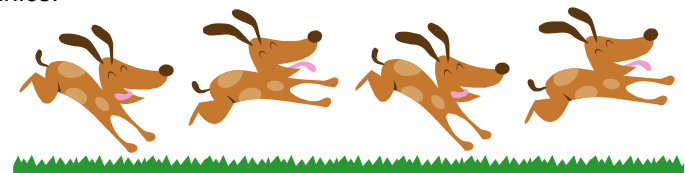
- The safety of the dogs is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all obstacles safely.
- All dogs must be on leash or crated at all times except when in the ring, when participating in the various challenges, or when in the designated agility warm-up areas.
- It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the Trial Committee, be asked to leave the trial site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made.
- Unsportsmanlike conduct, including rough handling or misconduct of any kind, will result in an excusal from the ring.
- Bitches in season are not permitted in the trial. The club will refund all but \$25 of the entry fee for bitches unable to compete for that reason. The trial secretary must receive written notification from a Veterinarian of such claim for refund (email accepted if followed by letter sent via snail mail) before May 14, 2016.
- Entry fees will not be refunded for pulling your dog after May 2, 2016, for any reason other than being in season, life threatening illness or injury of dog or handler, or death of the dog. The trial secretary must receive written notification from a Veterinarian of such claim for refund (email accepted if followed by letter sent via snail mail).
- Entries will not be accepted without fees. No entries will be accepted which require a signature for delivery. All entries must be submitted on an Official TDAA Agility Entry Form.

- Unsigned, incomplete, or illegible entries are not accepted. Faxed entries and/or credit cards cannot be accepted. Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry.
- A \$35.00 service charge will be charged for any returned checks. Subsequent returned checks from the same exhibitor may result in their being put on a CASH ONLY basis.
- Entry fees will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by action of the Trial Committee.
- No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot be opened or completed by reason of riots, civil disturbance, fire, an act of God, public emergency, an act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee
- Food and toys are not permitted in the course area, even during obstacle familiarization, and handlers are not allowed to use whistles or other instruments or devices.
- Exhibitors are responsible for being at the ring gate when it is their turn to run.
- At the handler's option, the dog may wear a flat (buckle or quick release) collar with or without tags, or wear adornments, clothing, ties or other attachments. Choke collars, pinch collars, electric and dummy electric collars are prohibited.
- Exhibitors may wear clothing or insignia of their training group if they wish.
- This trial shall be judged under the current Rules and Regulations of TDAA.

Move-Ups

Move ups will be accepted for dogs earning a title at a prior show with written notice to the trial secretary no later than 6:00 pm Thursday, May 19; emails are accepted. Next day move ups during the Petit Prix will be accepted. Same day move ups will not be accepted.

Please note: Move-ups will also be accepted by Marsha Houston for the warm-up clinics.



Crating

You may set up crates between 5:00 and 6:00 p.m. Thursday or beginning at 7 a.m. when the building opens on Friday. Crating areas will be marked.

Please set up only within the marked areas.

Obstacles and Ring Condition

Obstacles will meet the specification for obstacles in the current edition of the TDAA Rules and Regulations. All classes will take place indoors on a dirt surface. Ring size will be a minimum of 60' by 60'. Electronic timing may be used.

The following is a list of obstacles to be used:

A-frame (6'8" slatted)	Table (30" by 30")
Teeter (8' slatless plank)	Dog walk (8' slatted ramps)
Weave poles (20" centers)	Single & winged jumps
Open (Pipe) Tunnel (16" diameter)	Tire Jump (18" diameter)

Closed (Collapsed) Tunnel (16" diameter – 8' chute)

Disabled Handlers

For **TRIAL** scoring, handlers with mobility limitations may qualify for a course time exemption. Proof of disability must be presented and may be sent in with the entry or presented to the trial secretary at check in. Acceptable documentation includes handicapped parking placard/sticker, physician certification, or other official documentation of the disability. Disabled handler exemptions are not recognized for **TOURNAMENT** scoring.

Height Divisions

Owners are responsible for entering the proper height division. Judges reserve the right to measure dogs entered in any trial. At the handler's option, dogs may be entered in a higher height division, but not in a division lower than their proper height division. Provisional dogs must be measured by a judge.

- 2" jump height Restricted to dogs measuring 4" or less at the withers; or dogs with jump a height exemption measuring 8" or less.
- 4" jump height Restricted to dogs measuring 8" or less at the withers; or dogs with jump a height exemption measuring 12" or less.
- 8" jump height Restricted to dogs measuring 12" or less at the withers; or dogs with a jump height exemption measuring 16" or less.
- 12" jump height Restricted to dogs measuring 16" or less at the withers; or dogs with a jump height exemption measuring 20" or less.
- 16" jump height Restricted to dogs 20" or less at the withers.

Veteran – A jump height exemption (next lower height) will be granted to veteran dogs. A veteran dog is a dog at least 7 years of age. There is no special system of titling for veteran dogs. In addition to the jump height exemption, Veteran dogs receive an extension in standard course time.

TIME EXEMPTIONS and TOURNAMENT SCORING

The Disabled Handler and Veteran Dog time exemptions described above DO NOT APPLY TO TOURNAMENT SCORING at the Petit Prix.

These exemptions *WILL* be used at the score table to calculate Q's that will count toward *regular* TDAA titles and for calculating scores for special awards.

Neither disabled handlers nor veteran dogs are allowed extra time in games when there is a time limit. If the briefing says small dogs have 30 seconds and tall dogs have 25 seconds for point accumulation, no adjustment is made in the actual running of the ring. Everyone receives those respective times for point accumulation.

There is a maximum course time that is imposed throughout the tournament, which would be sufficient to include a SCT for beginner dogs and intermediate dogs to Qualify at their regular level even though they are being judged at the Superior and Games III level.

Directions to Trial Site

The Douglas County Fairgrounds in Castle Rock, Colorado are located approximately 30 miles south of the Denver and 40 miles north of Colorado Springs. Major highways through Denver are I-70 and I-25. Airline service to Denver is through Denver International Airport (DIA). Limited service is also available to the Colorado Springs Airport.

The Fairgrounds are located one mile east of Interstate 25 at Castle Rock Exit #181. If driving from the North, take I-25 south to the Plum Creek Exit #181 and turn left at the signal onto Plum Creek Parkway. If driving from the South, take I-25 north to the Plum Creek Exit #181 and turn right onto Plum Creek Parkway at the signal light.

Go east on Plum Creek Parkway, approximately one mile to Fairgrounds Road (the 3rd signal light). Turn left on Fairgrounds Road and follow the road North to the Indoor Events Center. Parking is available on the North and South ends of building.
